## “A Man in a Red Suit or a Baby in a Manger?”

Every year at this time Christians find themselves pulled in two different directions. There is the worldly understanding of Christmas as little more than a winter break with the opportunity to give and receive gifts from one another under the guise of the gifts being given by an old man in a red suit. And then there is the Christian understanding; a celebration of the giving of the greatest gift in history, Jesus born a babe in Bethlehem and a forward look towards Christ's return. Two different symbols of the season—a man in a red suit and a baby in a manger.

Not too long-ago Starr and I were at a Christian bookstore and we came upon a figurine that had Santa Claus kneeling at the manger. It turns out that this image has been around for some time now, but we hadn't seen it before and so we started talking about it. Did we like it? What did we think about the blending of the two images? Is it a “theologically” appropriate image? According to the store manager it had caused controversy for him as well; he had the figurine in the store window until someone complained loudly about it and he took it out.



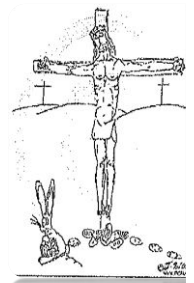
When Starr first pointed it out to me, I cringed. I didn't like the image at all (nor did she). We simply saw it as another way that culture tries to water down the true meaning of Christmas. After all, if you can make Santa and Jesus interchangeable then Christians will eventually see Santa and Jesus as the same thing with the same meaning.

But, as our conversation continued, we thought that that maybe it wasn't such a bad image. After all, Santa is kneeling to baby Jesus. That image of the secular and materialistic approach to Christmas is kneeling in worship to the Son of God. That, at least to us, seemed to place the proper perspective on the issue. However—does that mean that Santa has been around forever? Or at least that he lived before the Christ child was born? Hmmmm, of course there has always been God's way and our way. If Santa represents more than just Christmas but also our rebellion against God's way, then it's true that Santa has existed as long as people have.

That, however, places Santa in a very negative light. I've always enjoyed the story of St. Nicholas from whom the Santa Claus tradition grew. St. Nicholas was a bishop in the early church (around 300 AD) who inherited a lot of money from his parents when they died. He was known for secretly giving gifts of money to the poor. Saint Nicholas' name changed over the centuries and the Dutch eventually knew him as Sinterklass, which became, in English, Santa Claus. For St. Nick, and for modern Christians, gift giving is an outward sign of our loving response to God's great gift to us.

So; is Santa, at least originally, a symbol of humanity's rebellion against God and God's hope for us? Or is he a symbol of our loving response to God? Regardless of the answer to where Santa comes from; is he in competition to our celebrating Christmas as Christians? Is it better that we place him at Jesus' feet or in opposition to him? All of us respond to images differently. Maybe Starr and I over-analyze them just a bit☺. But as each of you enter this season, I would invite you to consider the images you use to symbolize Christmas. Do those images reflect your faith? Do they uplift God and the great gift God has given us? Do they water down the message of Christ? Would a stranger walking into your home immediately know that you worship the One, True God? Or would they think you worship the material world?

In the end Starr and I both decided we didn't like the figurine. We just can't put Santa and Jesus into the same image. Starr put it best for both of us when she said it would be just like having the Easter bunny hopping around a cross and hiding eggs in the empty tomb.

Parish Ed – Cross has extended an invitation to have our Sunday School kids join their Christmas program on Sunday, December 15<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am. Decision was made to not have service at Zion that morning and we join their 10 am service. No 8:30 am Worship service at Zion this day.

Evangelism – We will be gathering donations for the Ashippun Bread Basket on Thanksgiving. Decorating the church for Christmas will be on Saturday, November 30<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am.

Missions – The giving tree will be set up with gifts going to the residents at Shorehaven. All gifts should be returned to the church by December 8<sup>th</sup>. Council members will serve a Christmas meal for the Ashippun Apartment residents on December 8<sup>th</sup>.

Stewardship – November 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> will be Stewardship Sundays. Skits and temple talks will be part of the service.

Building and Grounds – a new sign for the upper parking is being quoted. Zion's service time will be updated on the lower parking lot sign.

Old Business – a revised church directory will be handed out. Please let Danielle know if there are any changes.

New Business – Discussed having a food drive for the Ashippun Bread Basket on Thanksgiving and other options throughout the year. They are currently in need for food and cash donations. Council positions open next year are Stewardship, Parish Ed and Evangelism. Please give it some thought if you are asked to run for one of these positions. It was decided that the Forever Young club can continue to use the church basement for their monthly gathering for \$25.00 per month. A new water heater was installed.

The next Council meeting will be on December 8<sup>th</sup>. Motion was made by Christine, seconded by Doreen to adjourn the meeting at 11:10 am, motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
