Exodus 20:6 "...but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who **love** me and keep my commandments."

Dear friends in Christ,

It's February, Valentine's Day is just around the corner and stores across the nation are stocked up on sappy Hallmark cards expressing our *feeling* of love

for important people in our lives. As I was reading some of the cards in a store last week I thought of something my wife (Starr) wrote on Facebook on our anniversary a number of years ago: "Love is patient, love is kind, love is a choice - glad we chose each other." Modern culture, reinforced by Hallmark and others, would have us think that love is nothing but an emotion. It is something we "fall into" as though it were a ditch at the side of the road that we are powerless to avoid.

But as God's people we are called to understand love as something more. There is a clear divide on this subject by professionals – secular writers – psychiatrists, psychologists, etc. that I read all say that love is nothing but a biological or genetic response to chemical reactions in the body. But Christian writers emphasize that love is a gift from God and that we have both the ability and the *need* to choose to love. In the Old Testament Hebrew one of the words used for love means "to choose for", over and against something else. We make a choice for God, and in doing so we choose **not** to put other things above God; money, power, food, etc.

In loving God we also choose to follow his commandments. For those of you who have been out of confirmation for a while you let me remind you that the commandments can be divided into two categories. The first three describe our relationship with God and the last seven describe our relationship with others. Jesus, of course, narrowed the 10 down to two – Love the Lord, your God, ... and your neighbor as yourself. What do these commandments mean for us if love isn't about a warm, fuzzy feeling but about a conscious choice for our neighbor? God didn't love the world so much that he bought us all Hallmark cards, instead he chose to act out that love in Jesus Christ.

When love is a choice and not simply an emotion, we honestly don't even have to know our neighbor well, or even like them, to choose for them. How would our world look if every one of us chose for our neighbor as we would for ourselves? If every choice, we make from buying food and choosing to what stores to support to casting our votes at election time is about what is as good for our neighbor as it is for us?

I invite you this Valentine's Day, and every day, to make a choice. Not which card to buy, but how it will impact your neighbor. Remember that old cliché "even if you choose to do nothing, you have still made a choice."
