Dear Friends in Christ,

As I walked outside this morning with my new puppy, I felt the bite of the chill in the air the clouds blocking the sun's warmth, and I couldn't wait to get back inside. I had a difficult time believing that last weekend it was nearly 60°. I was outside doing yard cleanup and helping a neighbor who had to take a brittle tree down. A little later this morning, while watching the news, the weather headlines caught my eye; "Strong storms in Kentucky," and "Multi-day Severe Weather Threat in Southern and Central U.S". Parts of California just got 70 inches of snow dumped on them, and flood watches are increasing across the country. Spring officially begins in 3 days, yet as Spring makes its presence known with clear, sunny days and warmer weather the Winter is not yet ready to let go. Weather patterns collide violently; the old resists the new and Old Man Winter does not go out quietly.

The battle going on throughout the country reminds me of the battle which goes on in each of us as we struggle to bring our faith into our everyday lives. Paul writes that "...our old man was crucified with Him (*Jesus*), that the body of sin might be done away with..."(Rom 6:6) and that we are to put on the "...new man which was created according to God..."(Eph 4:24). Just as it is a foregone conclusion that spring will prevail over winter and the season will change, in our baptism it is also a foregone conclusion that old will die and the new triumph. But just because the end is known that doesn't mean that it will come about easily.

So, it is with our faith. Though we can talk about doing what God desires of us, without the daily practice of immersing ourselves in God's Word, we will often drop into the patterns and habits of the *old man* in practice, especially under pressure. With a daily practice of devotions, prayer, and study of God's word the new skills and habits win the battle against the old and the new season is ushered in.


