Dear friends in Christ,

Believe it or not we are quickly approaching Ash Wednesday – February 17th this year. That signals the start of the Lenten season. Lent is intended as a time of reflection. We are called to reflect closely on how our life shows forth our faith. It is also a time to recommit ourselves to a closer walk with God. Often, as a symbol of our intent to place God at the center of our lives we choose to surrender something in our lives that will symbolize those other choices we make that do not

prioritize God. We make a sacrifice. This sacrifice itself does not bring us closer to God. God's sacrifice on the cross of Christ has already restored us to an intimate relationship with God.

This upcoming Lenten season may be the most difficult one I've faced in my faith life. It was in the third week of Lent last year that everything came to a crashing close. Though difficult because it was new the closing of the churches brought new challenges for me as your pastor to seek new ways for us to be a community in Christ together; to worship and be the church. This year – its old! The struggles are still there, but the uniqueness of the challenges is past.

It feels like we've already given up so much how can we make a new sacrifice this Lent? I think that is the central challenge to our Lenten journey this year. Because, while we have indeed given up much this last year, I wonder if we have replaced those things with a renewed focus on God. Or, have we found ourselves spending more time on our devices – smartphones, computers, consoles, etc.? These things are not bad in themselves, indeed they can be incredibly good for us to a degree. We stay connected with others, learn things, and continue to earn an income because of them.

This Lenten season I would like to encourage all of us to find ways to prioritize God once again in our daily life. There are many ways we can do this; and yes, some of them may even include more use of our devices.

- As I look outside this morning and see the snowfall, I also see the beauty of God's creation. Spending more time outside with an intentional focus on enjoying the beauty of creation and considering how we can work to protect and preserve it would be a wonderful Lenten discipline.
- Setting aside intentional prayer time, away from the clamor and busyness of the world (maybe while taking a walk outside 😊). Opening ourselves to God and the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
- Daily study of scripture and devotions. God has been revealed to us through the Word. Without spending time in the Word, we cannot grow closer to God. To be the incarnate body of Christ in the world we must learn intimately the life of Jesus.
- Gather together in community – safely. Just because we cannot always be in the same place with one another doesn't mean we cannot gather. This is where our devices can be a true blessing. By phone or video, we can check in with one another, pray together, and lift each other up.

These are only a few ideas. I encourage you to share others. Thank you for all you have done this last year as we have continued to be the body of Christ in our communities.

Evangelism – continuing to send cards to congregation members, Little Free Library book donations (especially children's books) can be dropped off at church, cards and small gifts are given to the Ashippun Apartment residents every other month. 
Special thanks to Friends of Zion for donating 15 children's books and to Emerald Clovers HCE members for donating 10 children's books.

- 1. B – Jesus spent 40 days fasting and being tempted in the desert.

- 7. B – Pancakes. On Shrove Tuesday, people used up all their rich food (eggs, butter) to prepare for the limited meals and fasting during lent. 'Shrove' means to confess, they were encouraged to say sorry to God before the beginning of lent.
- 8. C – Put ashes on your forehead. The ashes are often from the burnt remains of last year's palm crosses.
- 9. C – Donkeys were viewed as animals of peace while horses were viewed as animals of war.
- 10. A – Alleluia. This exclamation of praise was not said so it would remain special and used to celebrate and praise God on Easter Sunday.
- 11. B – Spy Wednesday, because Judas spied on Jesus and his disciples in the garden of Gethsemane
