For the next almost 20 years I struggled to figure out what the future held. I went into a very dark pit, kind of like a boat with no sail, just going where the wind took me.

Eventually I was able to look back on the past 20 years. I had to ask myself what kept me alive. I started to realize that maybe God had a plan for me, but what was it? Treasurer's Report – Balance \$40,000. July was \$200 short

Parish Ed – Cross and Zion only have 6 or 7 kids between the two congregations, looking into doing something joint.

Worship – nothing new Laurie Schwefel has accepted our position as music director. Need to decide what protocols we need to follow in light of the delta variant, we will keep an eye on it.

Evangelism – cards/birthday, etc. is being handled for Ashippun apartments. We need a person on council for this position.

Mission – Served 115 people at Bread & Roses, which included takeout meals. Next project is the Christmas Giving Tree for Shorehaven.

Stewardship – Planning to do a skit and table talk, in addition to handing out pledge cards with the Time & Talent sheets. Hoping to get out in mid or late October.

Building & Grounds – Priced windows for choir area. Metal doors need repair in fellowship hall. Refrigerator is fixed. Tent has been rented for Oktoberfest from the Lebanon Lion's Club.

Old Business – Keep using one screen in sanctuary. Help is needed for Oktoberfest, setup on Saturday October 2<sup>nd</sup> and Sunday October 3<sup>rd</sup> for take down. Worship will be at 10 am that day.

New Business – Reaching out to people who have not been in church for quite some time, what is the best way to reach out to people? Evaluate Pastor on a regular basis, every 2 years.

Next Council meeting is October 10<sup>th</sup>. Meeting adjourned at 10:19 am and closed with the Lord's Prayer





PASTA


With Pastor
