

# Through Zion's Window

September 2022

Dear friends in Christ,

In the last few years I've used the term "Lutheran Law/Gospel dynamic" many times. On not a few of those occasions I caught a blank look on the face of whoever heard me. Since I like this part of Lutheranism and I'll probably refer to it many times in the future I think this would be a good opportunity to explain, simply, how I understand the differences between the "Law" and the "Gospel". This is a bit deeper than I can get into in one page, so today I will share the definitions of "Law" and "Gospel" and spend some time breaking down "Gospel". And, over the next couple of months, we'll learn about what is meant by the "Law" and sum it all up at the end. I invite you to keep these letters and refresh yourself on them each month as we expand our understanding of this confusing topic.

The Law is best understood as "That which God demands we do for ourselves and for our neighbor and God will not do for us." And the Gospel can be defined as "That which you cannot do for yourself therefore God does it fully, freely, and without condition for you."

Let's start with Gospel or "Good News". The Gospels in the Bible are the stories of the Good News of Jesus Christ, but the Gospels contain both Law and Gospel. I realize this can be confusing, but when I am saying "Gospel" in this letter I am not talking about the books of the Bible. With the understanding of the Gospel definition above we see that proclaiming the Gospel, therefore, is simply sharing the story of the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ for our redemption. As we read the scriptures we come across many stories of loving and caring for our neighbors, feeding the poor, etc. All of these things we do for our neighbors or ourselves and they may be good news (lower case) for everyone who receives the care. However, because we do them for each other and it is not God who is doing them for us because we cannot, these words are not Gospel. When looked at this way we can see that the Gospel is only about the one thing we cannot do for ourselves – gain our salvation. Because we cannot do this, God has done it and that is our "Good News." Luther says, "...when your conscience is terrified by the Law and is wrestling with the judgment of God...rely only on grace and the Word of comfort."<sup>1</sup> The Gospel is used when the Law has failed – failed to comfort us, failed to give us hope, failed to answer our questions. The Gospel is not for the mundane happy moments of life, but to comfort and uplift us when everything seems to be darkest.

**Romans 5:1-2** Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Debbie Guenther and seconded by Suzy Rather. Motion carried. Meeting was adjourned at 10:40 am. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

If you are interested in participating in the baking of our Communion bread each week, a sign-up sheet is available in the narthex on the bulletin board. It's a great way to participate.

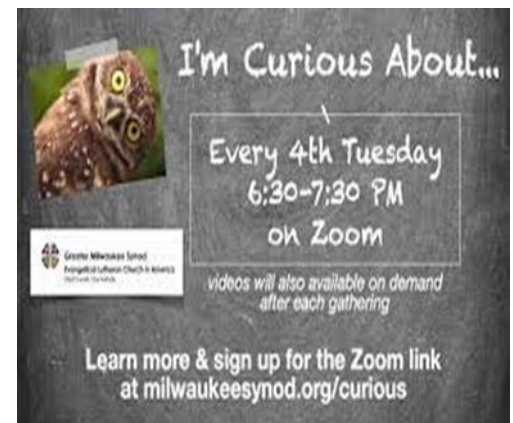
